

Elder Ordination Procedure

- 1. Local church asks permission from the English Presbytery to elect elders.
- 2. Upon approval by the English Presbytery, the local church holds elections within three months of the Presbytery's approval.
- 3. Upon the successful election of elder candidate(s), the local church submits either Session or congregational meeting minutes showing the election results.

[Steps 4 and 5 can occur simultaneously]

- 4. Elder candidate takes exams on the Bible (Old Testament and New Testament), KPCA Constitution, and Creed administered by the English Presbytery. The Regional Committee Chair proctors the exams.
- 5. Elder candidate undergoes training provided by his/her local church.
- 6. Upon the successful completion of the exams and training, the English Presbytery's Candidates and Credential Committee interviews the elder candidate.
- 7. Upon the Candidates and Credential Committee's approval, the English Presbytery votes on the elder candidate.
- 8. Upon the English Presbytery's approval, the elder candidate is ordained at an ordination service.
 - Ordination service can be held at the elder candidates local church. Moderator or vice-moderator of the English Presbytery must be present.
 - Ordination service must be completed within three months of being approved by the English Presbytery.
